Sept. 14 Bereuter lecture to be simulcast in Omaha

Former Nebraska Congressman Doug Bereuter will launch the 2009-10 E.N. Thompson Forum on World Issues with a lecture Sept. 14. It will be simulcast at the University of Nebraska at Omaha's Milo Bail Student Center, in the Chancellor's Room.

The E.N. Thompson lectures originate from the Lied Center for Performing Arts at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, with simulcasts in six communities statewide. The lecture and simulcasts begin at 7 p.m. and are free and open to the public.

Bereuter's lecture, entitled "China's Trade and Soft Power Relationships with Asia and the United States—Reason to Worry?" will provide insight into the U.S. trade deficit with China and China's influence on the developing world.
